Ling, King and Beeton 1955-68.
The first municipal theatre built in England after the War, hidden within the arcade of shop fronts.



CO-OPERATIVE STORE

C. S. Hay CWS Staff Architect 1954-6. Early in the precinct re-building Gibson's design materials palette, similar to BHS, M&S and Woolworths.



LOWER PRECINCT

Ling and Coventry City Architects staff 1957-60. Completed after Donald Gibson City Architect had left the city.



CITY MARKET

Ling with Beaton & Bradley and Berry City Engineer. 1956-7. Doughtnut shaped 200 stall market, roof car parking.



UPPER PRECINCT

Architects Staff 1948-56. The first large pedestrian precinct in the UK.

Hedley and Shorten Architects for British Railways. 1962-6. Influenced by Scandinavian design, high glass sides and open structure.

Coventry City Architects, Gibson/Moate 1948-53. Gibson's design materials, offices, shops and arcading canopy covered walkway.

Ling & Gregory McLellan 1962-6.

Coventry City Architects, Gibson/Moate 1948-53. There are many pieces of public art attached to all sides of the building.

Architect Sir Basil Spence Design Competition 1950. Construction ommenced 1954 and consecrated in1962

Herbert, Son & Sawday of Leicester 1954-60. In tune with Gibson's design materials, brickwork, windows and stone plus covered walkways.
